Webinar Overview

Webinar Description

This webinar teaches Enterprise Architecture (EA) to IT professionals in general and senior executives in particular in how they can align technology to the mission of their organization. It is a two-hour online session that gives participants the opportunity to begin to develop their EA for their organization. The instructor will guide participants in this hands-on workshop. As a key component in IT Strategic Planning, Enterprise Architecture provides a framework that can show how a private company, a nonprofit organization, or a government agency will use technological resources to meet organizational needs. The purpose of this business-driven IT architecture is to realize the value of IT systems. Computer technology is expensive; but with proper strategy, the IT leader can communicate the reasons why the technology is needed and thus can persuade his or her organization to make the necessary investment. The instructor draws upon lessons from his book, Public Service Information Technology, (Routledge/Productivity Press, 2020) and from experience in modernizing government agencies and private companies. The instructor will use examples and share his experience in advising the Iraqi government. Participants will build their confidence and ability to apply Enterprise Architecture.

1. Understand the Enterprise Architecture framework in theory and practice;
